

Concept & Agenda

Background:

SysOrg was funded in the framework of the ERA-NET SUSFOOD2 and CORE Organic Cofunds Joint Call 2019. It is coordinated by the University of Kassel (UKA, Germany) and the consortium includes FH Münster University of Applied Sciences (FHM, Germany), University of Copenhagen (U-CPH, Denmark), Warsaw University of Life Sciences (WULS, Poland), Council for agricultural research and economics (CREA, Italy), International Centre for Advanced Mediterranean Agronomic Studies – Mediterranean Agronomic Institute of Bari (CIHEAM-Bari, Italy), and Ibn Tofail University (UIT, Morocco).

SysOrg aims to identify intervention and entry points to enable transition to resilient, sustainable food systems, and to identify how pathways to increase sustainable consumption and food production could be successfully designed. It focuses on 5 territorial food systems (Cilento in Italy, Copenhagen in Denmark, North-Hessia in Germany, Warsaw in Poland, and Kenitra in Morocco) and analyses them from four different perspectives (viz. system transition, diet, organic food & farming, waste).

In the framework of Work Package 3 “Project Management & Dissemination”, Task 3.2, SysOrg project envisages to organise two transnational multi-actor workshops (Cilento and Copenhagen workshop). CIHEAM Bari acts as Task 3.2 co-leader and is in charge of organising the first transnational workshop, Cilento workshop, in collaboration with the Bio-Distretto Cilento Association.

Objectives:

The aim of the transnational multi-actor workshop is twofold:

- to serve as a learning and exchange space for the project partners and stakeholders, and
- to disseminate the results of SysOrg to other actors in the case study areas and beyond.

The first workshop, Cilento workshop, focuses on the harmonisation of research methods and the discussion of challenges and ways to address them. Workshop exchanges will lead to the finalisation of WP1 Methodological Guidelines (D1.1)

Format & Location

The workshops were included in the project design to allow project partners to gain practical experience by visiting the “host” case studies and meeting with stakeholders, thus combining science and practice. Unfortunately, due to the pandemic situation, the 1st transnational

workshop, originally planned to be held in Cilento, the Italian case territory, will be held online over two days in morning sessions. The virtual event will be organised and managed by CIHEAM Bari in close collaboration with Cilento Bio-District Association.
